Applications are invited for the admission to
M. A. in Bengali, M. Sc. in Chemistry and M. Sc. in Zoology
at Jhargram Raj College, under Vidyasagar University for the academic session 2018-2019.

The applications can only be submitted **online** at
www.jrc.ac.in

and no other mode of application exists. After successful submission of the online application forms, the applicants may pay the requisite **application fee of Rs. 150.00** (Rupees one hundred and fifty only) through the

- **online mode** (using Credit/Debit cards or Net banking facility, as mentioned in the admission website) or in the
- **offline mode** by **paying in cash** at the **designated branches of AXIS Bank** using the **Bank Challan** generated.

Candidates are **not required to submit** any print-out/hardcopy of the filled up online application form.

The applications can be submitted online **up to 20th June 2018**. The requisite application fee of **Rs. 150.00** (Rupees one hundred and fifty only) should also be submitted as mentioned above within **21st June 2018 (Upto 3.00 pm)**..

Eligibility Criteria:

M. A. in Bengali: 45% marks in Honours (for General candidates) and 40% marks in Honours (for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PWD candidates).

M. Sc. in Chemistry & Zoology: 50% marks in Honours (for General candidates) and 45% marks in Honours (for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PWD candidates).

Applicants are advised to periodically check the admission website for further notifications (if any).

SELECTION PROCEDURE

1. A **Common Entrance Test (CET)** will be conducted for all the applicants and the list of eligible candidates among the applicants will be notified in due time who can appear for the **CET**.
2. Selection will be made strictly on the basis of merit. Honours candidates for the current session and the immediately preceding session (2018 and 2017, respectively) are eligible to apply and will be considered equally. The merit list will be based on the marks obtained in the Entrance Test (50% weightage) and marks obtained in the Honours subject (50% weightage). In case of a tie, total marks/percentage of marks of immediately preceding examination (H. S. or equivalent) will be taken into account for ranking. In case of further tie, the total marks/percentage of marks obtained in the General papers of the B. A. / B. Sc. examination may be taken into account for ranking.
3. 60% of the total seats in each subject will be considered for the students of Vidyasagar University and the remaining 40% will be for Open Competition.
4. Quota for the SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PWD will be considered as per Government order 906 Edn / Estt dated 18/09/1997. The number of seats will be calculated and considered separately for 60% seats for students of Vidyasagar University and 40% seats for Open Competition. A fraction of 0.5 or more will be rounded to the next whole number. In case of the non-availability of students of SC category, the seats reserved for SC may be converted to the ST category, and vice versa (vide Item No. (iii) of the Vidyasagar University circular with Ref. No.: VU/PG/186/17, dated 29.05.2017 from the Secretary, Faculty Council for PG Studies).
5. In case of the non-availability of candidates of the OBC-A category, the seats for OBC-A may be converted to the OBC-B category and vice versa (vide Item No. (iv) of the Vidyasagar University circular with Ref. No.: VU/PG/186/17, dated 29.05.2017 from the Secretary, Faculty Council for PG Studies)
6. 3% of each category will be reserved for Person with Disability (PwD). Merit list will be prepared on the percentage of PwD. In case of the non-availability of candidates belonging to the Persons with Disability (PwD) category, the seats reserved for the said category will be converted to the General category (vide Item No. (v) of the Vidyasagar University circular with Ref. No.: VU/PG/186/17, dated 29.05.2017 from the Secretary, Faculty Council for PG Studies).

This 60% and 40% may be relaxed in case of non-availability of applicants in either category.

7. Counselling for admission to these courses will be held first for the 60% category followed by counseling of the 40% category.
8. The students of other universities and autonomous colleges become eligible to fill up the application forms for admission to the Post-Graduate courses with their marks obtained in B. A. (Honours) / B. Sc. (Honours) Part-I, Part-II and Part-III Examinations (total of Honours marks only). Candidates have to produce the original mark sheet of the final examinations (Part-III) for verification at the time of counseling-cum-admission session.
9. SC/ST candidates must have 75% of the marks obtained by the last candidate of the General category as qualifying marks. OBC-A/OBC-B candidates must have 90% of the marks obtained by the last candidate of the General category as qualifying marks. Candidates with lower marks will not be considered for admission even if the seats remain vacant in respective categories. (As per Memo No. 66-Edn(U)/1U-89/13 dated 16.01.2014 of the Higher Education Department, Government of West Bengal).
10. Questions for the Chemistry and Zoology Admission Test will be of the MCQ pattern with full marks of 50. There will be a total of 50 questions and the time allotted for the test will be 60 minutes. Questions will be set in English.
11. Questions for the Bengali Admission Test will comprise MCQ pattern questions having total marks of (1x25=) 25, 5 marks for English to Bengali translation, 10 marks for

Essay writing, 5x2/10 marks for writing short notes on Bengali Books (From ancient to contemporary Bengali literary works) [*i.e.* 25+5+10+10=50] and the time allotted for the test will be of 120 minutes. Questions will be set in Bengali.

12. Candidates admitted have to pay an amount of Rs. 1400.00 for M. A. in Bengali and Rs. 1700.00 for M. Sc. in Chemistry and Zoology as the examination fees per semester, in addition to the admission and tuition fees.
13. List of eligible candidates for **CET** belonging to both 60% and 40% categories will be put up in the website and **Admit Cards** for **CET** can be downloaded from the Admission Portal during specified dates, to be notified in the mean time.
14. The counseling of candidates for the 60% and 40% categories will be held in the respective Departments from 12.00 Noon onwards on the specified dates, to be notified in the mean time.
